DISABILITY SUPPORT SERVICES STONY BROOK UNIVERSITY

Disability Support Services assists students with disabilities in accessing the many resources of the University. Individuals with visual, mobility and hearing impairments, as well as those with hidden disabilities such as chronic medical conditions, psychological and learning disabilities are invited to make use of the services and equipment. The staff is here to support your interactions with faculty, staff and community agencies.

Services are provided to all eligible Stony Brook students covered under the ADA. Documentation is required to verify a disability and to determine appropriate accommodations. Services can only be initiated when students self-disclose their disabilities and request assistance. All information and documentation related to a disability is confidential, not part of the academic transcript and is not released without the student's written consent. The student must first be accepted to the University.

The admission procedures for students with disabilities are the same as for all applicants because they do not offer developmental or remedial programs. However, applicants identifying as having a disability are reviewed jointly by an admissions counselor and a DSS (Disability Support Services) staff member for additional consideration. These services are offered to individuals interested in applying for admission to undergraduate and graduate programs.
